# Mary, Our Blessed Mother, Happy Birthday!

Today, September 8 on the liturgical calendar, we celebrate the Blessed Mother's birthday. The date falls nine months after we celebrate the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. Because it falls on a Sunday this year, the celebration of the Twenty-Third Week in Ordinary Time supersedes Mary's celebration. We celebrate Mary throughout the year, but today we remember her on her birthday as we would anyone but especially our mothers. What can you do, you might ask? What would you do on your mother's birthday? Send a card, pay a visit, have a cake, make a phone call, bring flowers? We have many opportunities to honor Mary. Growing up in our home, we always had a cake for Mary on her birthday and sang to her. I am sure we probably prayed the rosary together as a family, which we did regularly gathered around a little Mary corner we had at the house. Mary asks us to pray and to know her son Jesus in our lives, and there is no better gift for Mary than to spend time with her son, Jesus. Why not make the day special by visiting the Mary altar and bringing her flowers?

A week or so ago, I encountered a young man in the church who was carrying a bouquet. He looked lost and was waiting to ask me a question while I spoke to another person. As I looked at him, he said, "I was asking people for a donation so I could go camping with Urban

Ventures, and this elderly woman said she would give me some money if I delivered these flowers to St. Olaf Church. So here I am, where do I put them? I am not Catholic, so I do not know what to do." I told him, "That's ok, I'll show you. Let's give the flowers to Mary, our Mother, and she will watch over this woman, and she'll be watching over you." I took him to the statue of Mary, and he placed the flowers on the altar. As he left, he asked if I could donate, and I told him I would send a check to Urban Ventures in his name to help him go camping. I told him that he was always welcome here and to know that Our Blessed Mother would watch over him. He thanked me and left.

Our Blessed Mother watches over all of us, and many evenings as I take a walk around downtown, I pray the rosary asking Our Blessed Mother to watch over downtown and to open the hearts of many to come to know her son Jesus, and that we at Saint Olaf may welcome all into our community. Celebrate today, know the Blessed Mother loves you!

Last weekend we celebrated our Lady of Cisne at Saints Cyril and Methodius with a Mass, a procession, and a fiesta. Our Lady appeared in 1594 in the town of Cisne, Ecuador to a young girl when a severe drought was upon the area. Our Lady told Angelita, this young girl, to tell

the people to stay. When they did, heavy rain fell in the area, and all became well again. I am accustomed to celebrating the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe in December, so celebrating our Lady in other cultures is just as beautiful an experience.

Today is National Grandparents' Day. We honor Grandparents for the wisdom they bring to families and the love they give to their grandchildren. I hear over and over from grandparents that they love to have their grandchildren over, spoil them, and then send them home. Let's honor grandparents today for the gift they are to families and the wisdom they bring to every community. Remember who your grandparents were to you and live into the wisdom they taught you! When I was a freshman at De La Salle High school and I was assigned my locker, I looked up and there was the picture of my grandfather's graduating class, 1910, right above my locker! I knew I would be inspired.
