A Celebration of “Our” Priests

The year for priests is drawing to a close — ending on June 19. But before it ends, the St. Olaf Parish Advisory Board wanted the parish to have a celebration of our own, honoring the priests from St. Olaf. In early March, we sent out an invitation to all priests who have been assigned here over the past 69 years as well as those who have helped out regularly and also to those priests who have come forward from the pews to be ordained. We sent out 37 invitations and as I write this article during Holy Week, we have 8 confirmed attendees.

The celebration will take place on Sunday, May 2 at the 4:00 pm Mass, where the visiting priests will concelebrate. Following Mass, there will be a reception in their honor in the Gathering Room, giving us a chance to welcome them home to St. Olaf and to catch up. I hope you are able to attend this celebration in honor of “our” priests.

Following the parish reception, there will be a private dinner held for the priests hosted by the advisory board members.

A Prayer for Priests

Lord Jesus, you have chosen your priests from among us and sent them out to proclaim your word and to act in your name. For so great a gift to your Church, we give you praise and thanksgiving. We ask you to fill them with the fire of your love, that their ministry may reveal your presence in the Church. By the same Holy Spirit, put your words on their lips and your love in their hearts, to bring good news to the poor and healing to the brokenhearted. And may the gift of Mary, your mother, watch over your priests and be their advocate in all things. We ask this in your most holy name. Amen.

DCEH Bike Program Begins

Last September, the Downtown Congregations to End Homelessness (DCEH) Bike Program collected over 100 used bikes to be refurbished and given to clients of four DCEH member outreach locations: St. Olaf Catholic Church, Basilica of Saint Mary, Central Lutheran Church, and Hennepin Avenue Methodist Church. Each of these programs will identify four guests per month, who are experiencing difficulty paying for transportation, to receive a bike. The first recipients will begin to receive bikes in April. The Basilica of St. Mary will host a Bike Blessing for all bikers on Sunday, May 2. Festivities begin at 11:00 am with an interfaith blessing at 1:15pm, followed by a group ride around Minneapolis. We will pray for the safety of all bikers and we will ask God for a special blessing for all those who will be using their new DCEH bikes this year. Risen Christ School serves lower income and immigrant children and families in Powderhorn Park and surrounding neighborhoods of south Minneapolis – children and families who are committed to improving their lives through rigorous, faith-based education. With 92% of K through 8th grade students living at or below the poverty line, every dollar raised is critical as tuition makes up only 10% of the School's revenue. 84% of every dollar raised goes to educate the students.

Tickets for the gala and raffle will be sold after Masses on April 17/18, and will also be available in the parish office. Raffle tickets are \$20 each, and the cash prize is \$2010. Gala tickets are \$115 per person.
