## ***St. Olaf and the Exodus Residence: It's About People, Not Just Programs***

In 1992 St. Olaf purchased the 8-story building (formerly the Pillsbury Club operated by the Women's Christian Association), and leased it to Catholic Charities for transitional housing. Seventy-seven men and 14 women moved into the building after just one month of the sale of the building to St. Olaf. The building and program which was named Exodus Hotel involved the parish in an innovated three-way collaboration, which to this day serves a critical affordable housing need in downtown Minneapolis. St. Olaf provides the building; Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis manages the housing and support services, and Hennepin County contributes some of the financial subsidy for the transitional and group residential housing. Today the program and building is called the Exodus Residence and continues to offers safe, affordable housing for single men and women working to achieve greater self sufficiency, stability and health. In 1998 St. Olaf received the Catholic Charities *Director's Community Service Award* for the contribution of the parish to the service of others by providing affordable housing in downtown Minneapolis.

One essential thing I've come to learn in my 12 years at St. Olaf and want to share is that the Exodus Residence is not simply about a building, but about people and relationships. I've been privileged to see how relationships have formed between parishioners, staff and the residents of Exodus. Some of our parishioners are also residents at Exodus, and are committed liturgical, hospitality and Social Outreach volunteer ministers. We are neighbors – often together enjoying Assisi Park, attending a St. Olaf concert, sharing hospitality in the Gathering Room, enjoying our fall picnic, advocating together and volunteering side by side in Social Outreach. At times, parishioners share gifts with

## Visit the Dead Sea Scrolls with St. Olaf

Explore the greatest archaeological find of the 20th century — the Dead Sea Scrolls, which include the earliest known texts of

the Bible. These 2,000-year-old, authentic text fragments are steeped in scientific, religious, and cultural significance. The exhibition offers a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to witness something truly remarkable. Join the tour beginning at St. Olaf with an insightful presentation on the significance of the Dead Sea Scrolls to our faith with Fr. Michael Patella, OSB, from St. John's. Then off to Qumran Experience at the Science Museum via the St. Olaf Coach. The event begins Fr. Patella's talk at 11:15 on Sunday, June 27, following the 10:00 am Mass.
