## *The Holy Land, Revisited*

As many of you know, I am traveling to the Holy Land with a pilgrimage group from June 13 to June 27. Because I am flying back on the 27th, I am not able to join the parish pilgrimage to St. Paul to see the Dead Sea Scrolls but I did visit the Dead Sea while in the Holy Land.

This article is difficult to write because I am writing it on June 11, two days before I leave on pilgrimage. I wish I could include some of the things I saw, but as I write, I have not seen any of them yet. I am quite sure that what I will see/have seen will be awesome.

The pilgrimage takes us to Nazareth, the Sea of Galilee, Mount Carmel, Cana, Mount Tabor, Jerusalem and the Dead Sea, just to name a few places. At the end of the pilgrimage, a smaller group is heading to Mount Sinai and then to Cairo. This is my first trip to the Holy Land and Egypt and I take the intentions of St. Olaf and our parishioners with me as I go.

Upon my return, a special welcome back event is scheduled on Sunday, July 11 in Fleming Hall following the 10:00 am Mass to share highlights and show pictures of our journey. All are invited to attend this celebration and hear from the pilgrims and me about our experiences. I invite you all to come and learn more about the places where Jesus lived and taught. Refreshments will be served.

This spring St. Olaf was invited to assist a new refugee family to resettle in Minneapolis through the World Relief MN resettlement program. The St. Olaf Commission on Social Justice learned about this program, the families served and how parishioners can help them to understand the local community and connect to education and employment opportunities.

For over 20 years, St. Olaf has been welcoming, worshipping with and assisting refugees, immigrants and persons seeking asylum in Minneapolis. Through efforts of individual parishioners and staff, they have found support, friendship and help with basic necessities including assistance with health care, education, furniture, volunteer experience, job referrals and connections to community services, including the Center for Victims of Torture. Our parish has also demonstrated solidarity with our global neighbors through the St. Olaf African Partnership with Kenya. Many relationships have been formed, faith shared and important church, school and health care needs funded through the financial donations of parishioners over the last 15 years.

### DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Jesus yearned for greater sensitivity on the part of his followers and chose the parable to stress the dire need for it. It is crucial to our faith as well as to our world that we respond to that yearning by being more sensitive to the feelings and hurts and wants of others.

2. What areas of life and faith serve as prime examples of insensitivity?
3. Describe occurrences and situations that received the benefit of a Good Samaritan. What has worked against the practice of sensitivity and compassion?
